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North Carolina 2024 GOP Primary

Overview

FIELD DATES: February 21, 2024

SAMPLE: Random Sample of 12,580 Likely Republican Primary Voters

MARGIN OF ERROR: \pm 5% at 99% confidence level

MODE: Verified Online Response

Methodology

This survey was conducted on February 21, 2024, with a random sample of 12,580 Likely Republican Primary Voters from across North Carolina. We defined "Likely Republican Primary Voters" as registered voters, both Republican and Unaffiliated (eligible under N.C.G.S. § 163-119 to participate in Republican primary elections), who vote in at least two of the last four Republican Primary Elections (2016, 2018, 2020, 2022). This signifies that they are more likely than not to participate in a Republican Primary Election.

Each member of our sample received one or more text messages that included both the online survey link and a unique validation code. This code served a multifaceted purpose, namely, to authenticate responses, eliminate the possibility of duplicate submissions, verify the identities of the individuals selected within our random sample, and, most importantly, to enhance the overall accuracy and reliability of the data collected in this study. We obtained 1.2% validated online responses and have a margin of error of \pm 5% at a 99% confidence level.

In summary, the combination of random sampling, a carefully defined sample group, and a robust validation process, along with an acceptable margin of error, leads us to be highly confident that the survey findings accurately represent the sentiment of Likely Republican Primary Voters in North Carolina.

This study was blind to race/ethnicity.


- Trump holds a commanding lead: Trump leads Haley by over 28 points among likely Republican primary voters (64% to 36%). This decisive of a margin so close to Super Tuesday, we likely won't see too much paid media from either candidate as they put their energy and resources into other states.
- Robinson maintains lead, Folwell is catching up: Robinson holds a strong position with the Republican primary electorate at 53% of the vote. His closest competitor, State Treasurer Dale Folwell, is 24 points behind him with 29% of the vote. While this is a distant second place, it shows growing momentum behind the Folwell campaign when compared to previous polls which had Folwell < 20% just weeks ago. Folwell is endorsed by the State Employees' Association of North Carolina (SEANC), which boasts the 2nd largest political action committee in the state. Short of any surprises, it is seeming Robinson will be the Nominee.
- Weatherman in driver's seat of LG race likely leading to runoff: In a crowded 11-way contest, former legislative aide Hal Weatherman is standing in the front of the line with well-known attorney Seth Woodall right behind him. There are several other notable names, including legislators past and present, who are strong contenders. Unless one of these candidates can break the 30% + 1 threshold, a runoff is certain.








1. HOW LIKELY ARE YOU TO VOTE IN THE 2024 REPUBLICAN PRIMARY ELECTION?


2. IF THE ELECTION WERE TODAY, WHO WOULD YOU VOTE FOR PRESIDENT?
